Use Restrictions:

- To reduce risks to bees due to spray drift, the area within 100 feet of the edge of the field (paddy) must be kept free of flowering weeds.
- **Application Timing:** Apply as required by scouting. Base timing of applications upon insect populations reaching locally determined economic thresholds.
- Application Rate: One application may be made per year at a rate of 4.5 to 6.0 fl oz per acre.
- **Maximum Allowed:** Do not exceed a total of 6.0 fl. oz. of Endigo ZCX (0.084 lb of thiamethoxam and 0.04 lb of lambda-cyhalothrin) per acre per year. Do not exceed a total of 0.12 lb a.i. of **any** lambda-cyhalothrin-containing products per acre per year.
- Pre-Harvest Interval (PHI): 21 days
- Water Volume: Apply by ground or air equipment using sufficient water volume to ensure thorough coverage of foliage. Do not use less than 2 GPA for aerial applications. Do not apply as an ultra-low volume (ULV) spray. Adding an emulsified crop oil (e.g. 1 pt. per acre) when lower aerial application volumes are used is recommended to help improve coverage, reduce evaporation, and improve efficacy.
- Flood Water: Do not release flood water within 7 days of an application.
- Aquaculture: Do not use treated rice fields for the aquaculture of edible fish and crustacea.
